Fur Traders' Keelboat - Steamboat Times The party left Fort Union on 6 July, 1833, aboard the 60ft keelboat Flora, arriving at Fort McKenzie on 9 August. This scene depicts events on 5 August when the keelboat stopped opposite an Atsina camp at the mouth of the Judith River. The camp comprised over 200 tipis and the boat was soon overrun by Indians wishing to trade. The Steamboat Postal History of Dakota Territory "Western ... The boat cost \$50,000 when built and is said to have paid for herself on the first round trip to Fort Benton. In the shipment that arrived into St. Louis from Fort Benton on Jun 17, 1867, the vessel contained 508 bales of buffalo robes, 43 wolf skins, 37 bundles of elk skins, and 5 packages of antelope skins.
